James 1:12



The course aims to strengthen your bond with your child, promotes healthy relationships and provides you with practical strategies to manage behaviour. This course offers the building blocks for secure attachment, parental confidence and happier home. The course is available to any of our families.

The course runs for 11 weeks (term time only) and in held at St Thomas's Church Thursdays 9:30am-11:30am, tea and coffee provided.

Invest in play (iip) is an international not-for-profit organisation with a mission to support children and their caregivers using practical and compassionate strategies which have been proven to work over many decades. We have co-created our programmes with local communities to provide the most current and culturally appropriate, research-based interventions to support parents and other caregivers around the world. We are an international team of psychologists who have been working with children and families for over 25 years. The study compared measurements before and after the intervention from 4 invest in play (iiP) groups. The outcomes were compared to control and intervention groups derived from a meta-analysis of 14 trials of a well-established evidence-based behavioural parent training programme.

The results show that:

iiP effectively reduced child behaviour problems with effects comparable to the well-established intervention. iiP effectively reduced parenting stress with considerably larger effects compared to the well-established intervention.

Parents in the iiP groups were more satisfied with the programme materials.
